What is a Shofet?

Rambam- not just a dayan (judge)

Malbim- a "catalyst" of teshuvah, causes others to return to the way of Hashem

Rav Soleveitchik- a spiritual leader, unifies and creates peace/harmony within the community

Abarbanel-

X	annointed	Selected by G-d
Torah daily issues	National, war, supplies	Military leaders, maintained judgement
X	Specific Halachot/restrictions	Allowed to give punishments not in Torah

How should the Shoftim era be viewed?

"Vayehi" introduces negative events, like in Ruth, Esther, etc.

<u>Malbim</u>- Yehoshua spoke directly to G-d, didn't need Urim V' tumim; the Shoftim can't; degeneration of holiness

- -Areas not conquered by Israel bother them most, failure on Bnei's part
- -Each tribe fights alone, less unity

Called "Sefer Hayashar" in Gemara Avodah Zarah, because Bnei Yisrael followed "in his eyes":

- 1) They were on such a high level, they did what was good in G-d's eyes even w/out a king
- 2) They did whatever was "yashar" in their own eyes, not G-d's. Relative morality.

<u>Daat Sofrim- "לֵלְיֵלְהְ לְּלֵל</u>" who will elevate. The purpose of the war was to make Israel more holy, to replace Cnaanim with Kedushah.

What's so important about Adoni Bezek, and why cut off his big toes/thumbs?

<u>Rashi</u>- Adoni Bezek, killed 70 kings, STILL was not powerful enough to be considered a "MELECH." Imagine how strong the KINGS must have been, and how much stronger is Bnei to conquer them!

Ralbag-

- 1) Instill fear in other kings and nations
- 2) Midah K'neged midah, Adoni Bezek did this to 70 kings. He mentions Elokim, that he is receiving G-d's manifestation of **justice.**

<u>Malbim</u>- value of confession. Because he admitted wrongdoings, he wasn't killed like usual.

Why did Yehudah go 1st?

Gemara: うろうな wrote Shoftim

(Megilat Ruth also takes place during Iftzan

the shofet, who may be Boaz)

Musar Haneviim-

- Yaakov blessed Yehudah that the others will "modeh," concede to him. Instead of denying his relationship with Tamar, he <u>concedes</u>, judged himself and admitted it.
- Gemarah Sota Nachshon took initiative, jumped in Red Sea first, was from Yehudah

<u>Kli Yakar</u>- yehudah, "admit." Just like you weren't embarrassed to admit your sin (like David's "chatati laHashem") your brother tribes won't be embarrassed to be subservient to you.

Why is he an angel, and why him?

Rashi- Pinchas

R' Horowitz-b/c he was a zealot, he was concerned that since Bnei Yisrael didn't drive out the other nations that they'll be influenced like in Bamidbar.

<u>Musar Haneviim</u>- angels don't do anything for themselves or alterior motives, just what H' wants. So too, a prophet has the same attributes when appointed to teach, all decisions for the community, not self.

Oz V'anavah- Just like Pinchas gave his soul up to the land of Israel, he is appropriate to warn about the negligence regarding the land. ALSO it was a double sin; national and religious, making treaties and leaving their mizbachot.
